WHAT A SCOUT SHOULD BRING TO CAMP:

CLOTHES:

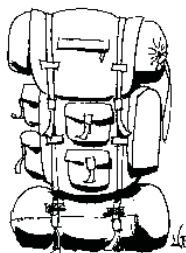
- Scout Uniform shirt, neckerchief, and hat
- Closed-toed Sneakers or hiking boots (2 pairs)
- Socks (6-7 pairs)
- Underwear
- T-shirts (1 long sleeve)
- Swimsuit (comfortable/functional/modest)
- Beach towels
- Shorts
- Long Pants
- Jacket
- Sweater/warm shirt
- Pajamas/sweat suit
- Hat (shade & rain)
- Raincoat/poncho
- OA Sash
- Work gloves

Face masks for the week
Personal bottle of hand sanitizer

Canvas Tents & Cots are provided by the camp

A SCOUT IS CLEAN:

- Towels (2 or 3)
- Washcloth
- Comb or hairbrush
- Toothbrush & toothpaste
- Soap
- Shampoo
- Bag for dirty clothes
- Handkerchiefs or tissues
- Mosquito repellent (**(Non-Aerosol)**)
- Sunscreen (**(Non-Aerosol)**)



STUFF YOU NEED FOR A GOOD TIME:

- Sleeping bag or 2-3 warm blankets and a sheet
- Pillow
- Scout Handbook**
- Merit Badge pamphlets & pre-requisite work/partial
- Flashlight/batteries
- Notebook & pencil/pen
- Fishing rod & tackle
- Folding pocketknife
- Knapsack/daypack
- Camera and film
- Compass
- First Aid kit
- Water shoes
- Wallet and money
- Refillable Water Bottle
- Ziplock/garbage bags
- Mosquito popup or netting with frame
- Whittling or Totin' Chip
- Watch
- Mess kit for outpost meals

- ☞ Pack it all in a footlocker, storage tote, overnight bag, or a backpack.
- ☞ Please wear your swimsuit and pack your towel and medications (in original containers) at the top of a daypack so that they can be quickly found during check-in.
- ☞ We suggest that each item of clothing and equipment arrives labeled with Scout's name, unit number, and town to help in returning items lost at camp.
- ☞ We cannot stress enough the importance of bringing the Scout Handbook and for older Scouts the Merit Badge Pamphlets and previous work for the badges you will be working on.
