## Other Important Information

### Campsites

Campsites will be assigned by the Camp Director based on unit sizes. Packs and Troops may camp together. Please advise staff of any special needs and these will be considered when assigning units to camp sites.

**Note:** units may be asked to share campsites depending on the number of campers and unit sizes.

### Parking & Early Arrival

We highly encourage condensing vehicles and Troops bringing the fewest vehicles possible. Parking may be limited, so please be patient and understanding upon arrival. Just because you “normally” park there, does not mean it may be a parking area during this weekend.

Day campers on Saturday will park in the main parking lot as directed.

Please adhere to all signage and staff guidance regarding where to park. Remember that our camp must be maintained and following our parking procedures will allow us to minimize our impact in true Leave-No-Trace fashion. ### General Do's and Don'ts

**DO** – follow the “Guide to Safe Scouting”; wear closed-toe shoes for safety; practice Leave-No-Trace. **DO NOT** – dig for any reason, ride in the backs of trucks, speed on camp, burn fires directly on ground, leave vehicles in campsites, leave trash bags in campsites, etc.

### Fires at Camp

If no local burn ban is in place, unit campfires are allowed in fire rings at their sites. **Most** (but not all) sites will have a permanent fire ring for units to use. If there is no fire ring in the assigned site, units are responsible for bringing their own fire pit, fire ring or barrel to use for campfires. **All campfires must be built off the ground and contained within the fire ring or a pan raised off the ground.**

**Please do not dig holes for campfires.** Campfires must be attended always, including when the unit attends activities. If the fire is not watched, it must be put out. You may bring firewood or burn dead-fall wood only. **Do not cut standing trees. Make sure all fires are completely out and COLD to the touch before leaving camp.**

## Troop/Crew Competition Events (All Day Saturday)

The following is a list of potential Troop/Crew Competition events that will occur throughout the day on Saturday. Troops will earn points based on their respective performance in each event. Awards will be given to the Top 3 point earners in each event.

***The number and nature of the events are dependent upon having enough units to volunteer to help run stations.*** Unit Leaders, please contact **Daniel Broadwell** ([danielbroadwell@gmail.com](mailto:danielbroadwell@gmail.com) ; **Mobile: 919-809-0332**) to reserve a spot to help with one of the following events.

**Hungry Scout:** Fire building and cooking a pancake – Patrol will build a suitable fire using tin cans and hot enough to cook a single pancake 2-3 inches diameter. This event is timed. Pancakes must be suitable for consumption.

### **Objectives**

1. Patrol brings all materials to the event.
2. Start a fire without using matches nor a lighter.
3. Cook pancake within 10 minutes after timer starts.

**Sound the Alarm:** Patrol will construct a ladder to climb and ring a bell.

### **Objectives**

1. Patrol brings 2 (8ft) poles and lashing ropes.
2. Build a ladder using provided rungs.
3. Patrol sound the alarm by using ladder to reach the bell.

**Save the Log:** Patrol will tie a series of knots between two stakes to lift a log off the ground.

### **Objectives**

1. Patrol brings six ropes for knot tying.
2. Patrol all required knots correctly (see photos).
3. Log suspended.

**Walking Scout:** Patrol will construct an A-Frame and walk it over set course.

### **Objectives**

1. Patrol brings 3 poles, lashing ropes, and 4 guide ropes.
  2. Build an A-Frame and attach guide ropes to A-Frame
  3. With a single scout in the A-Frame, patrol will walk the A-Frame to the finish line.
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**Hoisting your Patrol:** Patrol will work as a team to construct and raise a flagpole to fly their patrol flag.

**Objectives**

1. Patrol brings 3 poles, 4 lashing ropes, 2-3 lashing ropes to hoist the flag, 3 guide ropes, 1 small pulley or eye bolts, patrol flag, 3 stakes, and hammer.
2. Standup a flagpole using materials ropes and poles.
3. Hoist your patrol flag.

**Danger Kaboom:** Patrol will construct a transporter to safely carry nitro, then attempt to transport it without detonating it.

**Objectives**

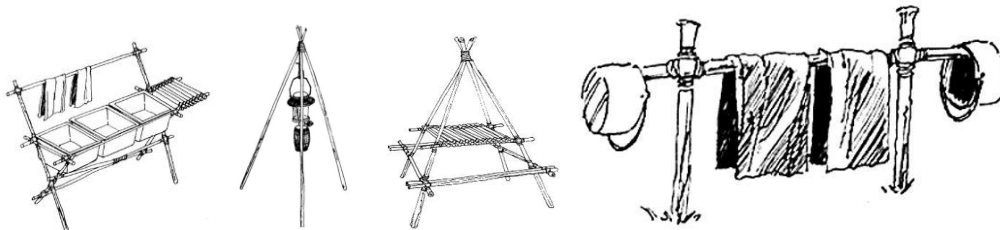
1. Patrol brings 6 poles and 7 lashing ropes.
2. Construct a transport.
3. Safely deliver nitro to contaminate area.

**First Aid Relay:** Patrol will apply first aid to an injured scout and carryout the injured to safety using lashed stretcher.

**Objectives**

1. Patrol brings first aid kit and materials to build stretcher.
2. Applied first aid and build stretcher.
3. Deliver injury to safety area.

**Build Camping Gear:** Patrol can earn points by building camping gear.
